Human GFAP, His Tag(GFP-H5143) is expressed from E.coli cells. It contains AA Met 1 - Met 432 (Accession # <u>P14136-1</u>).

This protein carries a polyhistidine tag at the N-terminus

The protein has a calculated MW of 51.9 kDa. The protein migrates as 50 kDa under reducing (R) condition (SDS-PAGE).

Endotoxin

Purity

>95% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Formulation

Supplied as $0.2~\mu m$ filtered solution in 20~mM Tris, 500~mM NaCl, 0.5~M Arginine, pH8.0 with trehalose as protectant.


Storage

SDS-PAGE





Background

GFAP (Glial fibrillary acidic protein) is a monomeric intermediate filament protein fund in mature astrocytes and other glial cells but is not found outside the CNS. Increased GFAP immunoreactivity (or astrocytic activation) is usually viewed as an index of gliosis or a relatively slow-developing correlate of neural damage.
